IF YOU GROW IT, SHOW IT!

Top Tips for Exhibitors

Read the schedule of classes carefully.

Give yourself enough time to stage your exhibits and check you have entered the correct number of specimens in each class. Our judges are very lenient and have been known to eat a pea pod or raspberry if too many were exhibited!

Make your exhibit look as attractive as possible to catch the judge's eye. Paper plates are very acceptable.

Take spares along in case of last-minute disasters.

Try to select specimens without blemishes. It is quite OK to pull off the odd blemished petal, but not too many!

When more than one flower/fruit or vegetable is asked for in an exhibit try to select for uniformity.

Potatoes should be washed but avoid scrubbing which can damage the skin. Don't over peel onions/shallots.

Tomatoes should be ripe, but firm and with the calyx (green bit and stalk) attached. Berries, beans and currants should have the stalks attached.

Do not be put off when staging your exhibit by the arrival of someone with larger potatoes or beans than you - the biggest is not always best!!

Jams, jellies, chutneys and pickles must be in glass jars, please check that the lid is not too tight to make it easy for the judges.

The more folk who enter, the better the spectacle for all who visit the show, and it is the taking part that is so important in a community project.

Our Village Hall



Our Village Hall is the heart of village life. It's where friendships are formed, plays performed, music heard, cakes baked, tea shared, dances danced and memories made!

Built in 1877, our Village Hall is held in trust for the enjoyment of the village and its visitors. It's day to day running is led by the Hall Committee. Our Trustees and Hall Committee are all villagers who volunteer their time to ensure this historic building remains the heart of the village for generations to come.

As a village, we're blessed to have such a beautiful, historic hall, and we're sure it has so many tales to tell! Over the years, it has been extended to provide multiple facilities for your party or function.

Downstairs we have a well equipped kitchen, bar and accessible toilet. Our Main Hall has seating for up to 80 people and our facilities include:

- Multimedia system with Dolby 5.1 Surround Sound
- 3 metre wide screen and overhead projection system
- Hearing aid loop
- Fibre broadband

Upstairs we have a small, conference/meeting room with large 4k monitor, chairs and tables to accommodate 10 to 15 people.

We also have plenty of onsite parking for hall users.

Our Village Hall is just a few minutes' walk from the historic Stanton Drew Stone Circle and St. Mary's Church and is opposite the welcoming Druids pub.

DEFINED RECIPE · CLASS 50

Cheese Scones

INGREDIENTS

225g (8oz) self-raising flour
1 level tsp dry mustard
½ level tsp salt
55g (2oz) grated Cheddar cheese
55g (2oz) butter or margarine
125ml (¼ pint) milk

Oven
190°C / Gas Mark 5

METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 190°C (Gas Mark 5).
2. Place the sieved flour, salt and mustard into a bowl and add the fat, cut into small pieces. Rub in until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.
3. Add the grated cheese and milk and stir until a smooth dough is formed. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured board until about 1cm (½ inch) thick.
4. Cut into rounds, place on a greased baking tray and brush the tops with a little milk.
5. Bake for 10–15 minutes, until the scones are well risen, golden brown and firm to the touch.

🌿 TOP TIPS FOR SHOW-WINNING SCONES 🌿

- 🌿 Use cold butter and a light hand when rubbing in — this keeps the scones from becoming heavy.
- 🌿 Avoid over-handling the dough; mix only until it comes together for the lightest texture.
- 🌿 Cut straight down with the cutter and don't twist — twisting can stop scones rising evenly.
- 🌿 For neat, uniform tops, avoid brushing milk down the cut sides, as this can hinder rising.
- 🌿 Bake on a high shelf and check from 10 minutes — judges favour an even, golden colour with a good rise.
- 🌿 Serve on the day of baking; cheese scones are at their best eaten fresh and still slightly warm.

HOW TO ENTER - 2026

If you would like to enter at the show, please follow the procedure below.

Entering the Show

This year, for the first time, entries can be made online! This speeds up the registration process for us all and means our team can hopefully escape the marquee to enjoy the show themselves for a bit too!

Online Entries will close at 10am Friday 21st 2026

Details and a link to the online entry system can be found on the Stanton Drew Village Hall website <https://stantondrewvillagehall.co.uk/stanton-drew-flower-show/> As its new this year please bear with us!

You can still enter using one of the paper entry forms printed in the centre of this programme. Please complete your form before arriving at the Show. Additional forms may be photocopied or downloaded and printed from the website.

- Whether entering via the online form or paper form, each person with any entries needs to complete their own entry form.
- Please write your name clearly and exactly as you would like it to appear on any certificates you may receive.

Number of Entries

You may enter as many classes as you wish. However, a maximum of three entries may be submitted in any one class number. For example:

5	Mixed seed heads in a vase
---	----------------------------

You can enter 3 different vases of mixed seed heads.

Only one award per exhibitor is given in each class number, even if you enter 3 entries per class number. Sadly, you can't win 1st, 2nd AND 3rd!

Before arriving, please make a note of the class number for each exhibit you intend to enter, as you will need this information when staging your exhibits.

Staging of Exhibits - Online Form Entries

Arrival on the day

Whether you have entered via the online form or paper form please visit the main marquee between **8:00 am and 10:30 am** on Saturday to collect your display tickets.

Each display ticket will show your exhibitor number and name. Your name will be folded under and hidden until judging has been completed.

Our stewards will help you complete your tickets if required and will direct you to either the Main Marquee/Church, depending on which classes you have entered.

Paper Form Entries

- Please bring your completed paper form with you on arrival.

Displaying Your Entries

- It is your responsibility to ensure that entries are staged in the correct class, although stewards will be happy to assist if needed.
- All entries are in position by 10:30 am so that judging can begin promptly. The general public are then asked to leave the marquee/church until the Flower Show opens.

Judging and Awards

- The Flower Show opens to the public at 1:30 pm, by this time, judging will be complete.
- The presentation of category trophies and the Best in Show Cup will take place at approximately 3:45 pm.

Stanton Drew Flower Show 2026 Rules and conditions

Booking in of entries will take place between 8 am and 10:30 am on the morning of the show.

If completing the online form, please see the information above regarding deadline for competition.

If completing by paper form please bring completed paper form.

- All flowers, vegetables and fruit in the Plant Categories must have been grown by the exhibitor, failure to comply will result in disqualification.
- All stands, vases and dishes to be provided by the exhibitor. Water will be available.
- An exhibitor may enter up to **three entries per class** but can only take one prize per class.
- For Arts and Crafts and Photography classes an exhibit cannot be re-entered within 5 years.
- The Committee will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final. There is no 'Appeal' process.
- Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in all classes.
- Points for the winning of cups are allocated as follows: -
1st - 3pts, 2nd - 2pts, and 3rd - 1pt for each class. Only one entry per class will be included in the aggregate score.
- There are several cups to be won for the various categories, and these remain the property of the Flower Show to be returned to the Committee by 31st July 2027, or one month before the next show, whichever is the sooner.
- **All exhibits must be left for display between 1:30 pm and 4:30 pm on Saturday 22 August and must be collected by 5.00pm that day after which time they will be disposed of.**
- Exhibitors are requested to name the varieties of plants, and materials/methods used in crafts where possible, to increase the general interest of the show.
- There is no entry fee for exhibits. You need not have grown the exhibits used in classes 57 & 59.
- Children may enter any of the adult classes, on an equal footing

The placing of exhibits is regarded as acceptance of these rules.

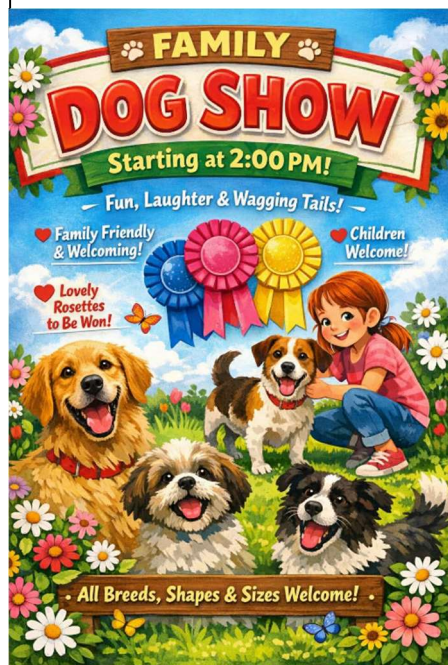

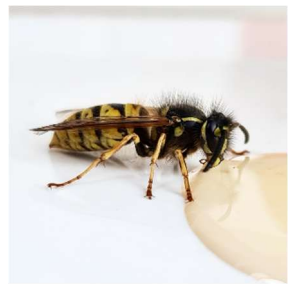
Please note:

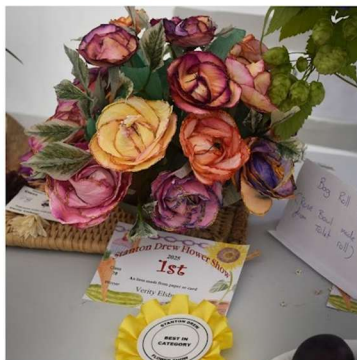


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
